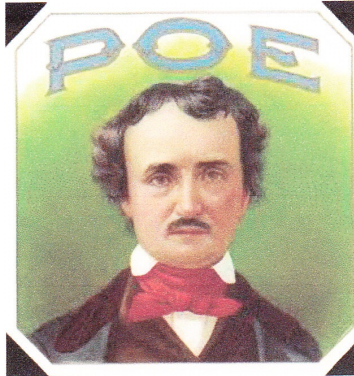

Dr. Keith Terrence Miller
President
Virginia State University

Dr. Keith T. Miller began his academic career in 1987 at Fairleigh Dickinson University's Teaneck Campus as an assistant professor in the Management and Marketing Department and as director of the campus' MBA program. In 1991, his last year there, he also served as interim chair of the Management and Marketing Department.

Dr. Miller moved to Quinnipiac College in Hamden, Conn., in 1991, where he spent three years as associate dean of the School of Business.

He later became the dean of the College of Business at Niagara University, a position he held from 1994-2001. During his tenure there, the university was granted accreditation by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) and enrollment in the Business College increased by 20 percent. Management of corporate and other external relationships was upgraded.

Dr. Miller was named provost and vice chancellor of the University of Wisconsin, Oshkosh, in 2001. While serving as chief academic officer there, Dr. Miller restructured the Academic Affairs Division to focus on faculty support, learning outcomes and curricular innovation, and helped to expand the opportunities available to students to participate in research activities with university faculty.

Dr. Miller is President Emeritus of Lock Haven University of Pennsylvania. Included in the Lock Haven University mission are service learning, global education, and integrated use of technology in the learning process, among other things.

On July 1, 2010, President Miller assumed his position as the 13th President of Virginia State University, a *Historically Black College or University* (HBCU) located in Chesterfield County, Virginia. He brings to this position a wealth of knowledge in academics and business both in the public and private sector. Dr. Miller earned his bachelor, master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Arizona.

Tour the recently remodeled
Virginia Museum of Fine Arts

Saturday, May 21st
11:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

You will self-tour the permanent collection, which spans the globe and more than 5,000 years. The museum's permanent collection encompasses more than 22,000 works of art, including the largest public collection of Faberge outside Russia and one of the nation's finest collections of American art. VMFA is also home to acclaimed collections of English Silver and Impressionist, Post-Impressionist, British Sporting and Contemporary art as well as renowned South Asian, Himalayan and African art.

The group luncheon will be held at noon in the beautiful Marble Hall. The Marble Hall was constructed in 1985 from pink Verona marble and Texas limestone. It is located between our Lewis Gallery of Modern and Contemporary Art and the Mellon Gallery on British Sporting Art. It is a lovely atmosphere, and a great spot to people-watch.

An optional exhibition: "Dynasty and Divinity: Ife Art in Ancient Nigeria" is a landmark exhibition devoted to the art of Ife (pronounced EE-fay), the ancient city in present day Nigeria that is the cradle of Yoruba civilization. The exhibition features more than 100 copper alloy, terracotta and stone sculptures, ranging in date from the 9th to the 19th centuries. Many of the works have never been on display outside of Nigeria.
