Camp Too Sweet will be held June 17 thru 21. The Lions will be there on June 17, to handle registration, eye screening, and hearing screening. The 17th will also be Lions Visitation Day. For the Lions that work in the morning, Carilion Health System will pay for the lunch. For the Lions that just come to visit and have lunch, there will be a \$8.00 charge. Please come out and visit with these Type 1 kids at this great camp.

In the future, when your clubs make contributions to Camp Too Sweet, please designate the monies for Diabetes Awareness and not Camp Too Sweet. Carilion Health Systems has secured a grant for the next three years to pay tuitions for all the campers. We will continue to support the camp in several other ways but our cost will be significantly less than in previous years.

Thanks to the hard work over the past few years of PDG Bill Brammer, we have a large amount of money designated for Camp Too Sweet in the 24-E Charity account. If contributions are received in the name of Camp Too Sweet, the money can only be used for Camp Too Sweet. If your club donations are made out to Diabetes Awareness they can be used for other projects as well, such as the JDRF Walk, diabetes screenings at Health Fairs, diabetes medications for people who can't afford them, etc.

Finally, I hope to see a good turn out at the State Convention. We have some excellent programs planned, as well as a great evening of entertainment on Thursday and the state finals of the Bland Contest on Friday. Lions Lowell Skelton (2nd VDG), Jim Newman (1st VDG) and I (DG) need your votes to get elected to serve District 24-E next year. We are all looking forward to serving in 2013-2014. Attention all Roanoke, Salem and Vinton Clubs. I hope that you are all aware of the Distract 24-E Community Eye Program. If you are not, please take a minute to look at the following information.

All Clubs in Roanoke, Salem and Vinton are encouraged to participate in the Community Eye Program which is overseen by Lion Tammie Brightwell, District 24-E Sight Chair. CEP encompasses a network of Opticians in the surrounding area that provide eye exams at a greatly reduced cost. Clients are referred by Social Services and follow an application process. Once applications are approved, clients are sent for a complete eye exam and return to the state office with a copy of the RX where they may select a new pair of designer frames. Using the new eyeglass program at the Fluvanna Women's Correctional Center we are able to provide designer eyeglasses at a very low cost. Interest in SPOT continues to grow throughout the District. We are in the process of writing grants to purchase new units to enable screening of more children. Thank you to Salem City and Botetourt County Schools for allowing Lions of Botetourt, Troutville, Salem and Edgewood Clubs to screen students. Many Clubs are screening Pre-Schools and Day Cares. Thank you to all that participate in this program

District 24E Charity

As President of the District 24E 501c3 Charity, I'm glad to be able to report to you on what's happening in the Charity.

On Sunday, March17, 2013 the Steering Committee of the 501c3 Charity met at the Sight Building in Roanoke. During that meeting we were able to meet some serious accord about changes to be made in both the Articles of Confederation and the By-Laws. These are presently being re-written. One area of major change includes items concerning membership at both Club level and to the Board of Directors. A second area will have us working on the design of the financial model for the money being invested in the 501c3. We are currently working with financial advisors and with fellow Lions who have financial backgrounds. A draft of the work, for discussion at the District level, will be available at the State Convention in May. Our goal is to have the 501c3 Charity in its new format by Fall Conference.
